Assessment:

Written assignment on how autism affects a specific individual within the class (3,500 words)	25% (15 credits)	January 2018
Written case study on a specific intervention (3,500 words)	25% (15 credits)	April 2018
Presentation to course participants	25% (15 credits)	July 2018
A reflective assignment on the course as a whole and their learning journey. (3,500 words)	25% (15 credits)	September 2018
