This month, we have been very busy working hard on our topics as well as many other exciting learning opportunities. Here's what we have been up to in our classes:

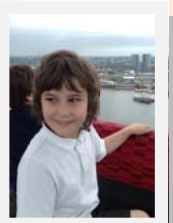
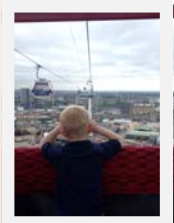
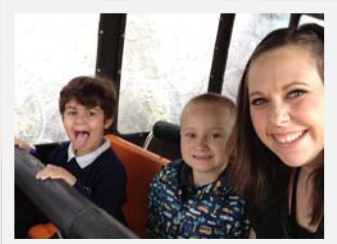
