Dear Families,

Our class teams are busy preparing every pupil's Unique Profile (UP). This is the document which highlights all the achievements that have been made within your child's PLP focus areas. We also want to include and celebrate an achievement from home and need your assistance to be able to do this in a meaningful way. We know that our pupils make progress at home in ways in which we may not even be aware of and this is a fantastic opportunity to recognise and celebrate these together.

Please fill out the template below and send it back to school via the home school contact book. Your class teacher will then ensure this included in the completed UP. Please share anything that has had a positive impact on your home life together, or something new that you have noticed your child has started to do or a skill that they are developing further. This information will also help your child's class team better decide how best to support their next steps.

An example may be 'He can now join in with our family dinner and wait until everyone is finished', 'She can now read the menu and make a choice on our family meal out', 'He can now proudly write his name on the pictures he draws', 'She can now tolerate having her teeth brushed', 'He enjoys joining in with the singing at our place of worship and can now stay until the end', 'She can now sign for more', 'She can now talk to new people and has made a friend at her football club', 'He is now reading bedtime stories to his brother', 'He can now read and understand the bus timetable'.

You may be aware of the five Engagement Model Areas;

Anticipation, Exploration, Initiation, Persistence and Realisation.

Engagement refers to the degree of attention, motivation, curiosity and interest that individuals show when they are developing new skills and knowledge. Supporting our pupils to be engaged is essential in order to support them to develop new skills, concepts and knowledge. If you have noticed examples of when your child is demonstrating any of these five areas and would like to share these with us, we would love to hear about that too. For example:

- **Initiation;** 'He can independently and spontaneously request to go outside by bringing me his coat', or 'He has started to initiate conversations with less familiar people and at church will say 'good morning' and 'how are you today?'
- **Anticipation;** 'When the music for In the Night Garden starts to play, he recognises that it is time for his bath and shows he is really excited about this'.
- **Exploration;** 'She has started to open the kitchen cupboards and pull items out to look at and explore'.
- **Persistence;** 'He finds reading longer books difficult but recently he has been really trying and is now picking chapter books from the library for us to read together'.
- **Realisation;** 'When her Grandad come into the room, her facial expressions show she realises and recognises who he is, and she giggles and smiles in delight'.

We really look forward to receiving your contribution. Please could we have these by Friday, 31st January 2025.
