Dear Riverside families,

I hope that you are all well and have had a good summer.

We have loved having your children back at school this week and I hope that they have been excited to come in and returned home happy. We have welcomed a number of new starters to all four sites and, if this is your child's first week at Riverside School, I hope it has been a positive start to their Riverside journey. I also hope that you start to feel part of the wider school community, the Riverside family soon.

Pupils, both new and existing have settled in really well to their new classes and have clearly enjoyed re-connecting with familiar faces. They have also started to develop new friendships and positive relationships with new classmates and staff. We know how important it is that your children feel secure in their new environments and the focus in these first few weeks is to form the kinds of relationships that will enable them to find their place and find their voice, in whatever form this takes. And however loud or quiet, we will always hear them and tailor our responses and approaches accordingly.

We now have 350 pupils, aged between 3 and 19 in 39 classes across our four sites: 25 at Riverside SPC, 6 at Riverside Beckenham, 5 at Riverside West Wickham, 3 at Riverside Phoenix and, as we continue to grow in size, please know that we will never lose sight of the things that really matter to you and your child. All of your children are wonderfully unique, with a whole range of strengths, interests and requirements and our commitment is to provide them with a profoundly personalised curriculum and an environment that enables them to flourish and feel truly valued for who they are.

Over the summer, we carried out extensive maintenance work on all four sites, both internally and externally and we are continuing to do our utmost to rectify the challenges we have had with our hydrotherapy pool. This remains a top priority for us and following some further remedial work undertaken during the summer holidays, we are one step closer to being able to set a potential re-opening date. We do need to manage expectations as there is still a significant amount of work needed but please be assured that we have ring-fenced funds and will continue to work closely with all the contractors currently involved to achieve a positive outcome as soon as we possibly can. In the meantime, if your child has hydrotherapy identified in their EHCP, I am sorry that we are unable to provide this on-site at the present time but please be assured that we really are doing whatever we can to rectify this. Thank you very much for your continued patience and understanding.

It has always been important to us that you receive the information you need to feel involved and included in all aspects of your child's school experience, so please let your child's teacher
