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As promised in previous letters, we will continue to update you on a weekly basis should any of our pupils or staff receive a positive COVID-19 test result across the school. We will of course inform you immediately if your child is directly affected. I can confirm that, since last Friday, through our asymptomatic testing programme, we have had just one member of staff testing positive in one of our Secondary classes at Riverside SPC, resulting in one class having to self-isolate.

One thing that has been particularly noticeable in recent weeks has been the continued sense of togetherness across our three sites and whether your child is at Riverside Beckenham, Riverside West Wickham or Riverside SPC, they, and you, are very much part of the wider whole school community. As and when we are able to "open up" even more in the weeks and months ahead, we can't wait to bring people together in ways that we haven't been able to recently.

This weekend marks exactly one year to the day that schools were directed to close their doors for the vast majority of children. I don't think that any of us knew then that we would be where we are today and we hope that, as a school, we have provided you and your child with the type of support that has made a positive difference. I am sure that over the coming days, weeks and months there will many quiet reflections and shared memories, both happy and sad, as well as conversations about "lessons learnt" from the past year. In the meantime, given that the theme of Rainbows has been prominent for us, as it has been for so many others, we wanted to share our very own recent Riverside Rainbow with you.
