Governor priorities for 2021/2022 and progress

1. Returning to a new normal – taking the best bits from our new ways of working and making sure we continually learn, build on and embed them in our practice going forwards.

We have:

- Rolled out Home Learning Plans (HLPs) to support all pupils' Personal Learning Plans (PLPs);
- Continued to ensure that The Pursuit of Happiness is embedded into our curriculum framework;
- Extended Community Experience for all Secondary-aged pupils;
- Increased personalisation in areas such as lunchtime arrangements and educational visits;
- Improved collaborative practice with therapy colleagues to ensure a joined-up approach to meeting holistic needs.
- 2. Prioritise family engagement, ensuring that pupils and families are able to tell us what they want from Riverside School.

We have:

- Reintroduced Riverside Connect;
- Opened the Riverside Lounge and refreshed The Happy Café;
- Carried out joiners' surveys to help us understand what families need from the school;
- Set up different pupil voice groups to campaign on local and national issues;
- Delivered our seventh annual Family Project.

3. Continuing to develop performing arts and extending our partnerships within the context of COVID-19 / post-COVID.

We have:

- Extended our collaboration with Rose Bruford College to included both performance and training opportunities;
- Extended our partnership with Peoplescape Theatre and facilitated visits to The Barbican;
- Supported A New Direction to contribute to the "I Am" Festival;
- Contributed to a virtual international collaboration project (to be released soon);

4. Continue our journey to foster an inclusive environment, where all members of our community feel welcomed and valued, and can bring their whole selves to the school

We have:

- Launched our Be Here. Be You. Belong agenda on all three sites;
- Set up Reflective Libraries which reflect and celebrate our whole school population;
- Increased and improved diversity and representation in school displays and signage;
- Distributed termly newsletters to chart our journey and progress to date;
- Produced a whole school film to capture our year's work (to be released soon).
