In 2009, he was appointed by the Secretary of State for Education as Director of the Children with Complex Learning Difficulties and Disabilities Research Project. Since completing that research, Barry has overseen the development of a national project developing online 'Training materials for teachers of children with severe, profound and complex learning disabilities'. He is the author of over 150 articles and many texts on a range of learning disability/ special needs topics .Barry lectures nationally and internationally.
